Resolution 0312-W Series 2019-Backflow Prevention:

Lippert states that according to the State of Colorado, we have to have a resolution on the books. This gives us the authority to create standard and to enforce it. They are targeting commercial and multifamily users.

Public Works Director's Report:

Lippert states the reports came back pretty good. TTHM's came in really low. Lippert handed out a raw water map. It is divided into 3 quadrants which breaks it into watering every 3 days. We are looking at an irrigation season between May and September. 1 ½ CFS will be run every day. Lippert says there will

be days where there will be a lot of usage and days that won't be enough usage and water will spill from the reservoir. He believes we will need at least 3 years of data before we will know exactly how to make it run smoothly. Lippert will probably put Jacob in charge of this. The remote tap customers will be attached to the north side of the quadrants. Every month the cards will have access to a certain amount of water to haul. They will not be able to carry over anything left on the card to the next month. We will give out a flyer with tips on how and when the water should be run. Tim will put a meter on his raw water tap at his house to monitor the usage.

Nancy Heim wants to know if they can store water? Lippert says he doesn't see why not.

Lippert is pretty confident that we have more than enough water. Grafmyer points out that when we started this project, it was set up to provide water to around 420 taps. The green quadrant has potential to grow. Finn thinks we should work on getting emails for future invoicing. Nancy suggests asking for emails with the annual bills.
