# Review/Consent Agenda:

Tim says the computer at the Water Shack has been messing up. It is really old. The system has even added money to Water Shack accounts instead of subtracted when they have come to get water. This computer is running on Vista. It needs to be replaced.

Tim says that the valves were put in at the Redvale locations and that they installed two more flushing hydrants.

There is an apparent perception in the community that we shouldn't sell water taps right now because of the dry conditions. Finn would like to discuss how to address this with the public, so they understand how it all comes together. Patti Grafmyer said she would look at the calendar.

### **Administration Reports:**

Patti Grafmyer informed the NWC Board that Tim Lippert has given a retirement date. Patti passed around the updated job description and advised that it may require us to split the position between two people.

Patti presented the MLS listing for the old Tucker property. She stated that they have it advertised as development property for a potential of approximately 100 units with application in process. The NWC does not have an application for this property.

Patti discussed the Water Conservation and Drought Plan with the NWC Board. At this time there are still no restrictions, and the general consensus is that there does not seem to be the need to restrict anything at this time. We are in "dry conditions" so we will continue to encourage conservation with NWC customers watering before 9am and after 5pm on the proper designated calendar day. The Water Dispensary customers will continue to be allowed to purchase no more than 5,000 gallons within 30 days.

Patti passed along that Candy Meehan would like to thank the NWC Board for providing the \$135.00 worth of food for the Wright's Mesa Water Appreciation Day event.

Patti provided a small list of contract operators to the NWC Board which cover southwestern and western Colorado.
